## THE VIEW FROM EVERLEIGH

Covid-19 continues to dominate the headlines with the situation constantly evolving. Village Area Co-ordinators remain in place and alert to the needs of parishioners as required in the face of an uncertain future. A village Litter Pick took place on Saturday 24th October. Many thanks go to the 13 volunteers who took part and collected 15 bags of rubbish. Everleigh is certainly looking a lot cleaner as a result.

Everleigh linked up with Collingbourne Ducis for a Remembrance Service on Sunday 8th November outside St Andrew's Church by the War Memorial. It was an abbreviated affair and outside with plenty of social distancing. All went well and we had a good turnout of 25 people.

Recycle bins on Marlborough Road were not emptied on Tuesday 3rd November as scheduled. This was reported several times by a resident and then by the Parish Council. Wiltshire Council responded that they are unable to return to collect missed waste collections that are reported more than two working days after the collection date. In the event Marlborough Road recycle waste was collected on Tuesday 10th November. Villagers are therefore requested to report missed waste collections within 48hrs on the MyWilts app and/or on the Wiltshire Council Hotline: **0300 456 0100**.

We are fortunate in Everleigh to live in a beautiful rural location on the eastern edge of Salisbury Plain with little threat of crime. However, we should not be complacent and it would be wise to implement the following Wilts Police home security advice:

- Keep doors locked even when you are in the house
- All windows should be fitted with locks except those designated as fire escapes
- Never leave a spare key in a plant pot or letter box; a thief will know where to look
- Lock tools and ladders away so thieves can't use them to break in
- If you are going away overnight ask trusted neighbours to keep an eye on your property
- Be vigilant and if you see anyone acting suspiciously take their description and details of any vehicle registration including direction of travel and call the police on 101, or 999 if they are about to break into a property

We are delighted to welcome a new member to the Parish Council – Henry Waight, who was co-opted at the last Parish Council meeting on 27th October. Henry is a local farmer who resides at the Pigleaze Farmhouse, the new property overlooking Pigleaze Dairy.

We have also provided a weekly art therapy workshop to support children's wellbeing as they navigate their way through these unusual times.

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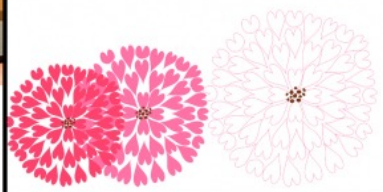


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## ALAN DOBSON

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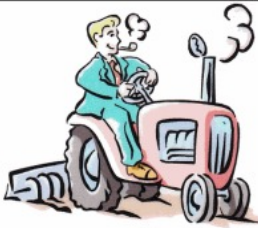


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
